DUES STRUCTURE

There are two major categories to choose from when calculating your organization's dues.

- II. General Business and Industry Organizations

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I. Highway-Related Organizations (Derives Significant Income from Transportation Funding Sources)

Trade and Professional Associations (Level 1)	Under 50 members	\$3000

II. Non Highway-Related General Business and Industry Organizations

B. General Businesses

Notes:

- Board members must meet minimal financial obligations of \$3000 as set by the Board of Directors
- Executive Committee Members must meet minimal financial obligations of \$6000 as set by the Board of Directors
- Trade/Professional Organizations must pay their recommended scheduled rate but may also pool their respective members' contributions in order to meet the minimal financial requirement of \$10,000 for Trade Associations to be on the Executive Committee
- Multiple firms owned by a single entity may pool resources and be required to pay only once within the appropriate dues schedule category for the pooled revenue of the various companies.
